



As well as our Library services, we have some great clubs and courses running this spring...


- Join us for our free Easter activity session on Wednesday 20th April 10am

- World Bee Day Friday 20th May – we will be making a buzz in Redruth Library on World Bee Day. Watch this space for all things Bee-autiful on that day.





As part of our Climate Action Plan, Redruth Town Council will continue to work within our own teams and buildings, and with other organisations. We are organising community litter picks and planting trees to start.

GO PEAT FREE AND HELP PROTECT THE PLANET

Peat has been a major ingredient of the compost used in gardening for many years. This peat is dug out of wild places, damaging some of the last remaining peatlands worldwide. The process also releases carbon into the atmosphere, accelerating climate change and destroys habitats.

The good news is, there are peat free composts available, using alternative materials that as well as being sustainable, are high in nutrients too. When you're next planting this spring, be sure to check the label on the compost you choose.

REDRUTH PRESS | CLOTWORTHY

Redruth Press screen print posters on community issues and use print to give people a chance to voice their own opinions on the many different changes that are being planned for Redruth Town centre.

Through a collaboration between two artists who live and work in Redruth – Caroline Wilkins and Tony Minnion - they use screen printing to generate striking posters that record, publicise and provoke discussion.

Their mobile screen printing workshop is used to start conversations at different places and events in and around Redruth and moves around so as to engage with as many people as possible. They also run art workshop sessions showing people how to print their own posters.



Their colourful designs are displayed in different sites all around town contributing a lively creative input into the conversation that's currently going on around the planning of Redruth Town Centre regeneration.



STREETDRAW24 IS COMING TO REDRUTH!

From noon Friday 22nd of July to noon Saturday 23rd of July, expect to see drawers young and old, professional and amateur out and about on the streets of Redruth for the town's first ever StreetDraw24. StreetDraw24 started in Falmouth in 2018 and follows a simple formula... An outside drawing event followed by an exhibition of the work created, with profits from selling original drawings helping support the work of local homelessness charity St Petros.

The event is being organised by Krowji-based illustrator and writer Helen Trevaskis who started StreetDraw24 while studying illustration as a mature student at Falmouth University. Helen set up StreetDraw24 to “do something good with what I’m good at” and is interested in encouraging us all to really look at where we live, something observation drawing really encourages. The exhibition will be split between The Art Room in Redruth town centre and Stones at Krowji and is keen that even those who don’t see themselves as artists get involved.

SETTING THE SPARK WITH REDRUTH'S TORMENTORS, DEMONS, ANGELS AND SAINTS

Golden Tree Productions are 'Setting the Spark' for their pen an gwari research project with a series of 'Hellfire Kernow' events in Redruth...

Four Kap'n Kryw ('Crew Captains') and four Krefter Kryw ('Crew Makers') have been appointed to work closely with pupils from Redruth School and the wider community in a series of creative workshops, preparing to stage the first trial 'Hellfire' event at the end of May.

Over the course of a day, four distinct 'Hellfire Crews' of Tormentors, Demons, Angels and Saints will ready themselves at Crew Bases in corners of town. The inaugural 'Redruth Hurling Championships' will be held at Redruth Rugby Club, with the costumed, colourful Crews each supporting their team with chants and encouragements. Afterwards, the glorious champions will be paraded around Redruth, along the 'Plain-an-Gwarry Trail' and the procession will finish with a dramatic fire sculpture finale.


