REDRUTH REVIVAL UPDATE

A New Face for the New Year in Redruth



2024 promises to be a momentous year for Redruth town centre. Redruth Revival Community Interest Company's ambitious restoration of The

Buttermarket will be completed later this year, creating a unique venue for eating, working and being entertained. Building work continues and this month sees the arrival of a key member of the team, General Manager Jonathan Bray, who takes the helm of this exciting new venture in establishing The Buttermarket.

Made possible with support from the National Lottery Heritage Fund, The High Street Heritage Action Zone, Architectural Heritage Fund and the hard work of a team of dedicated volunteers. The Buttermarket will be a commercial creative cluster of artisan producers hoping to re-invigorate the town centre. Based around a courtyard of kitchens, the new venture is designed as a springboard for fledgling businesses to explore their identities and develop their own brand and following. The hope is that these businesses will flourish and outgrow the cluster, moving to their own premises in town. The long term strategy is for these businesses to form the backbone of an evening economy for Redruth.

Redruth Revival Chair and driving force, Judy Davidson MBE said "My number one ambition for The Buttermarket is to put fun back into the town centre. Now feels like a point in history when we all need to come together and celebrate the good in humanity. What could be a better reason for people to keep returning to the town centre and continuing support all of the lovely local businesses found there?"

When the project fully launches this summer, the residents of the town can visit The Buttermarket's eight kitchens both day and night in one special courtyard restaurant. Diverse dining in a historic building: artisan and street foods, craft beers, chosen wines and fine coffee. The opportunity to meet and eat, day and evening, in the open or undercover. All



situated in a vibrant cluster of lovinglyrestored heritage building, it will host live entertainment, artisans and independent shops and workshops, a gallery and regular markets.

Jonathan says 'There will be more operational positions becoming available as the project moves towards launch, but right now my main focus will be on finding the perfect tenants to deliver the board's vision."
